How the Closet Works

1. Set up an appointment to pick up business attire (can be done either in person or online at <http://tamucareercloset.setmore.com/>)
2. Choose what business attire you want to rent
3. Return rented attire after having it dry cleaned for a small fee (\$5 voucher for Park Cleaners given when suit is checked out)

Closet FAQs

- **Who can check-out a suit?**
Current Texas A&M students.
- **What size suits are available?**
For women, skirts and blazers range in size from 2-22W and 2-18 in pants. For men, pants go from 30x30 to 38x32 and 36S to 52L in jackets.
- **How long can I check-out a suit?**
The standard check-out time for suits is 1 week, including having the suit dry-cleaned.
- **What if I need to keep the suit longer than a week?**
Extended check-outs can be requested prior to your appointment. Please send an email to the Career Closet with "Extended Check-Out:(Name)" in the subject line. In the body of the email, include your first and last name, UIN, and the reason for requesting an extended check-out.
- **Where do I get my suit dry-cleaned?**
Park Cleaners (314 George Bush Dr.) is a partner of the Career Closet. The Career Closet provides a voucher to students at the time the student checks out a suit, which provides a \$5 subsidized cleaning rate at Park Cleaners.
- **Can I donate business attire to the closet?**
Yes! They accept suits, ties, blouses, dress shirts, and other kinds of professional attire. Check the website for a list of accepted gifts and guidelines.

Be a Volunteer

- **What is my role as a volunteer?**
You will help fellow Ags in enhancing their professional image. This include greeting students, guiding them through the check-in/out process, and other assigned duties. You will also select to be involved in one of the Career Closet's committees: Development, External Operations, and Marketing/Communications.
- **What is the time commitment for volunteering?**
Volunteers are asked to commit 4 hours per month during Closet operation hours. Volunteers are also required to attend a one-hour monthly meeting.
