Sustainability Master Plan

Texas A&M University has worked hard to incorporate sustainability into every component of the institution. The first Sustainability Master Plan was created in 2010 under President R. Bowen Loftin to analyze the ways the campus is making sustainability an Aggie tradition while identifying areas of growth for the future.

The updated Sustainability Master Plan was just released in the fall of 2018. This new plan renews the university’s commitment to “meet the needs of the present without compromising the future.” It outlines goals that A&M will work towards over the next 20 years. The campus-wide Sustainability Master Plan served as an example for Residence Life as their department-level Sustainability Plan was created.
